

ARABIC WORDS, PHRASES AND NUMBERS

Here are a few common phrases in Arabic. Note that there is a different way of speaking to a boy or girl. An easy introduction to these words is to ask your class to turn to their neighbor and say the right gender if they are a boy or a girl. They may then answer with My name is...Ismi (their name).

If one does not know who they are writing to, then use the male gender of speech as the formal way to talk.

In Arabic speaking countries there is a saying. "When you speak someone's language, you are close to their heart."

Marhabah (mar Hu bauh): Hello

Ismi (is mee): My name is...

Shu Ismak? (boy) (shoo iss mauk): What is your name?

Shu Ismek? (girl) (shoo iss mayk): What is your name?

Ana saken fi kariyat Eugene, Oregon, fi America (boy)

(ah nah sah ken fee kah ree yaht.....fee): I live in Eugene Oregon in America. (boy)

Ana sakne fi kariyat Eugene, Oregon, fi America (girl)

(ah nah sah ken fee kah ree yaht.....fee) I live in Eugene Oregon in America (girl)

Min waynak? (boy)

(min way nauk) Where are you from?

Min waynek? (girl)

(min way nayk) Where are you from?
